<p><b><u>Diabetes</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Preferable but only for uninsured, US residents:</u></b></p> <p><i>Oral: Januvia, Janumet 50/1000, Janumet 50/1000 XR, Invokana,</i> <i>Humulin N, R, or 70/30 10ml vials (no pens), Humalog U-100 10ml vials (no pens)</i></p> <p><b>Oral:</b> Metformin, glipizide, glyburide, glimepiride, pioglitazone</p> <p><b>Neuropathy:</b> Gabapentin, amitriptyline, nortriptyline, cyanocobalamin (B12 tablets), duloxetine</p> <p><b>Injectable:</b> <i>WalMart has Novolin N, R and 70/30 for \$24.88 per 10 ml vial.
