Please put “With Spacer” in inhaler prescription text and we will dispense and instruct patient.</p> <p>SABA (Rescue Inhaler): Ventolin (60 puffs)</p> <p>ICS or LABA + ICS: Wixela 500/50 (through 9/20)</p> <p>LAMA: Yupelri (revefenacin) for nebulizer (through 9/20)</p> <p>LABA + LAMA: Stiolto Respimat</p> <p>Nasal: Fluticasone (Flonase) nasal spray</p> <p>Oral: Montelukast, prednisone, diphenhydramine, loratadine, cetirizine, fexofenadine, cyproheptadine</p> <p>Injectable: Symjepi 0.15 mg/ 3 ml epinephrine injection (through 11/20)</p> <p>*We carry nebulizers. | <p><u>Diabetes</u></p> <p><u>Preferable but only for uninsured, US residents:</u></p> <p><i>Oral: Januvia, Janumet 50/1000, Janumet 50/1000 XR, Invokana 100mg and 300mg</i> <i>Injectable: Humulin N, R, or 70/30 10ml vials (no pens), Humalog U-100 10ml vials (no pens), Basaglar pens (exp. 7/20)</i></p> <p>Oral: Metformin, glipizide, glyburide, glimepiride, pioglitazone, Qtern 5/5 (through July 2021)</p> <p>Neuropathy: Gabapentin, amitriptyline, nortriptyline, cyanocobalamin (B12 tablets), duloxetine</p> <p>Injectable: <i>WalMart has Novolin N, R and 70/30 for \$24.88 per 10 ml vial or \$42.88/ 5 pens (Charitable Pharmacy has insulin for uninsured residents of Franklin County)</i></p> <p>Glucometer Kits and Supplies Available: Strips per month: #25 (orals only), #50 (on insulin) #100 (sliding scale / adjusting insulin dose) No Rx needed.</p> | <p><u>Mental Health</u></p> <p><u>Preferable but only for uninsured, US residents:</u></p> <p><i>Antidepressant: Prozac</i> <i>Antipsychotic: Zyprexa</i></p> <p>Antidepressants: Citalopram, escitalopram, fluoxetine, sertraline, paroxetine, venlafaxine, duloxetine, trazodone, bupropion SR and XL, amitriptyline, nortriptyline, mirtazapine</p> <p>Anti-Anxiety: Buspirone, hydroxyzine (SSRIs as above)</p> <p>Antipsychotics: Risperidone, haloperidol, olanzapine, quetiapine, ziprasidone, aripiprazole</p> <p>Mood Stabilizers: lithium, lamotrigine, topiramate, divalproex sodium</p> <p>ADHD: Atomoxetine, Guanfacine ER</p> <p>Substance Use Disorder: Disulfiram, Naltrexone (oral)</p> <p>Sleep: Melatonin (and see Antidepressants)</p> |
