Requirements: Ohio State Board of Pharmacy licensed pharmacist. Preferred advanced training such as community-based or ambulatory-focused residency. Preferred 3-5 years of pharmacy practice experience, and pharmacy manager experience a plus. Strong organizational and project management skills. Excellent verbal and written communication abilities.

Responsibilities

- Oversee daily operations including pharmacy scheduling, training, and professional development of pharmacy staff
- Deliver extraordinary direct patient care helping neighbors in need access prescription medications with appropriate follow-up
- Navigate formularies with patients and their providers to design optimal therapeutic regimens
- Perform efficient and accurate drug utilization review and management of the medication use system of the pharmacy on a daily basis
- Maximize inventory management of donated and purchased medications to prioritize utilization of donated inventory
- Precept advanced pharmacy experiential interns (APPEs)
- Precept PGY1 community-based pharmacy residents
- Develop advanced clinical services to meet pharmacy goals (medication therapy management, collaborative practice agreements, vaccination program, etc.)
- Develop collaborative mechanisms with community partners and hospital systems to optimize the care of underserved patients
- Oversee engagement, training, and appreciation of volunteers at the site including volunteer pharmacists, technicians, and students
- Perform Continuing Professional Development and set personal professional goals which align with Charitable Pharmacy's mission

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- Collaborate with the executive director to develop clinical pharmacy goals
- Flexibility to staff at all Charitable Pharmacy pharmacies
- Partner with Pharmacy Managers in delivering formative and summative feedback for all staff including pharmacists, technicians, social workers, and community health workers
- Ensure compliance with all state and federal laws governing the practice of pharmacy
- Contribute to the Continuing Quality Improvement program for the pharmacy
- Participate in annual community pharmacy self-assessment as part of Continuous Quality Improvement process and prepare written report for Executive Director
- Prepare for audits from the Ohio Board of Pharmacy, bulk replenishment programs, third party insurance, and other relevant partners.
